**The Energy Efficiency Fund and the Estonian Union of Cooperative Housing Associations Signed a Memorandum**

During the week, a Ukrainian delegation from the Energy Efficiency Fund visited Estonia to study practical experience in housing modernization, homeowners’ association management, and the implementation of energy-saving solutions. The highlight of the visit was the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding and Cooperation between the Energy Efficiency Fund and the Estonian Union of Cooperative Housing Associations (the EKYL) — a document that marks a new stage of partnership between Ukraine and Estonia in promoting sustainable development in the housing sector.

**Technical Seminar on Housing Sector Reform in Ukraine**

A technical seminar titled “Reforming the Housing Sector in Ukraine” was held in Kyiv, organized by the Ministry for Communities, Territories and Infrastructure Development together with the EU. The Chair of the Supervisory Board of the Energy Efficiency Fund, Yuliia Sabatiuk, emphasized the importance of scaling up the “ENERGODIM” and “VidnovyDIM” programs as comprehensive tools for the modernization and reconstruction of the housing stock. Ms. Sabatiuk also highlighted the role of municipalities in accelerating recovery and the need for sustainable support for homeowners’ associations.

## The Energy Efficiency Fund took part in the All-Ukrainian Forum of Multi-Apartment Building Managers.

The Fund’s Technical Director, Dmytro Syrykh, presented the “Energodim” and “VidnovyDIM” programmes and shared updates on their development. He emphasized that currently only homeowners’ associations are eligible to participate, but the EEFund is working to expand the circle of beneficiaries and hopes for support in the 2026 State Budget.

## Partnership with Builders — the Key to Recovery

Director of the Energy Efficiency Fund, Yehor Fareniuk, took part in a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Confederation of Builders of Ukraine during the KBU Business Day. He presented the EEFund’s results — over 2,140 projects, 70% of which have already been completed — and highlighted updates to the “Energodim” and “VidnovyDIM” programmes. Yehor Fareniuk emphasized the importance of cooperation with the construction community and thanked Globus Bank for resuming HOA’s lending during the war.

## Changes to the “VidnovyDIM” Program

The Supervisory Board of the Energy Efficiency Fund has approved changes to the “VidnovyDIM” Program. From now on, only homeowners’ associations with buildings that have sustained damage exceeding UAH 1 million can participate in the Program, and all projects must undergo state expertise. At the same time, associations with damage below UAH 1 million remain eligible if the damage occurred before November 2, 2025.

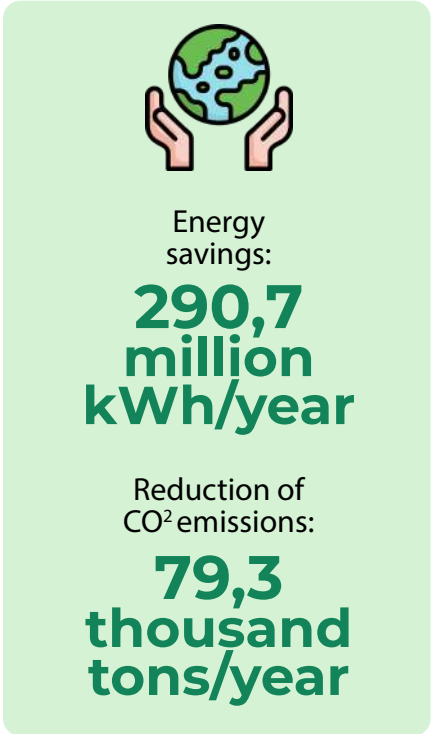
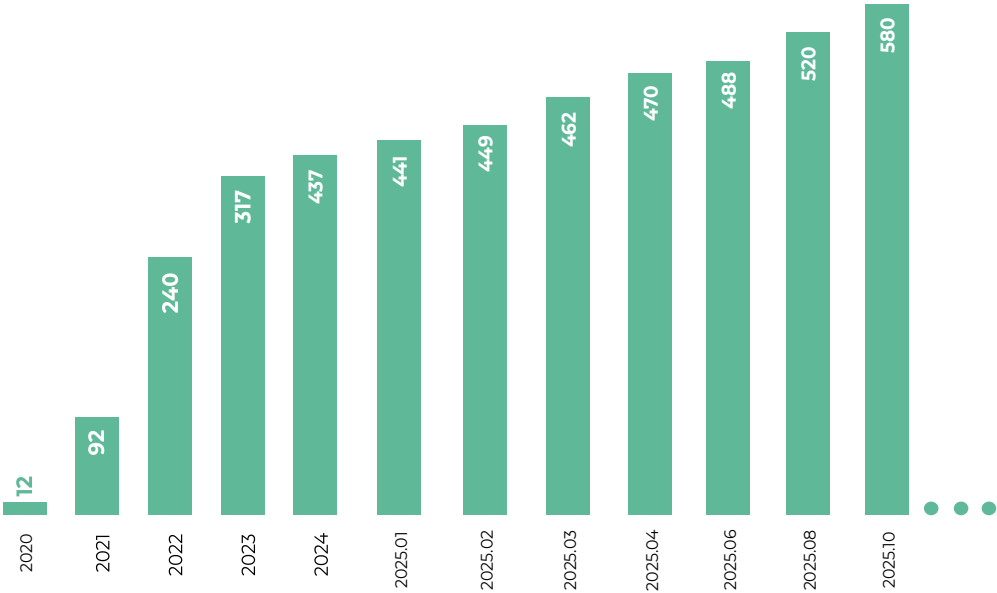
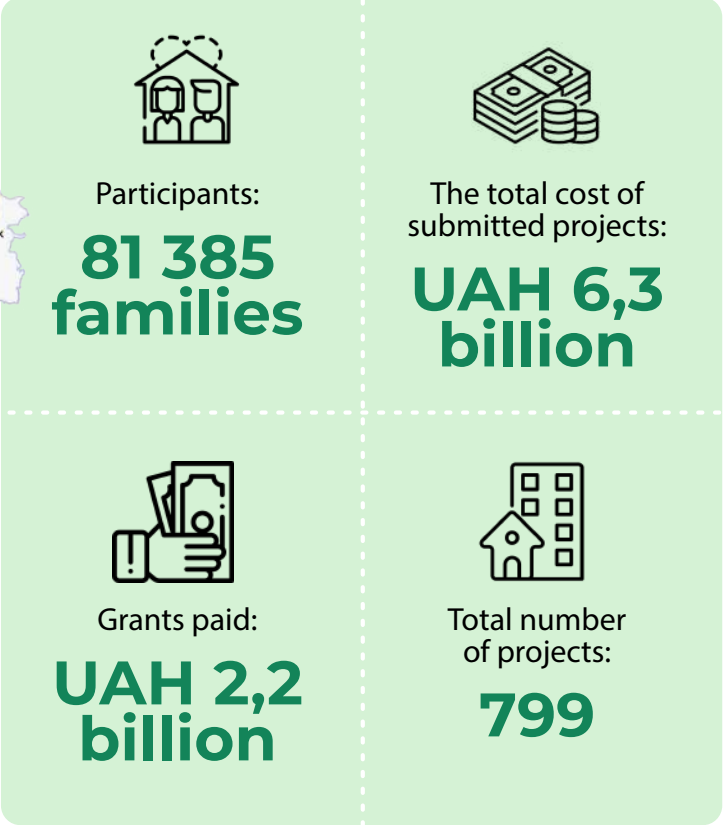
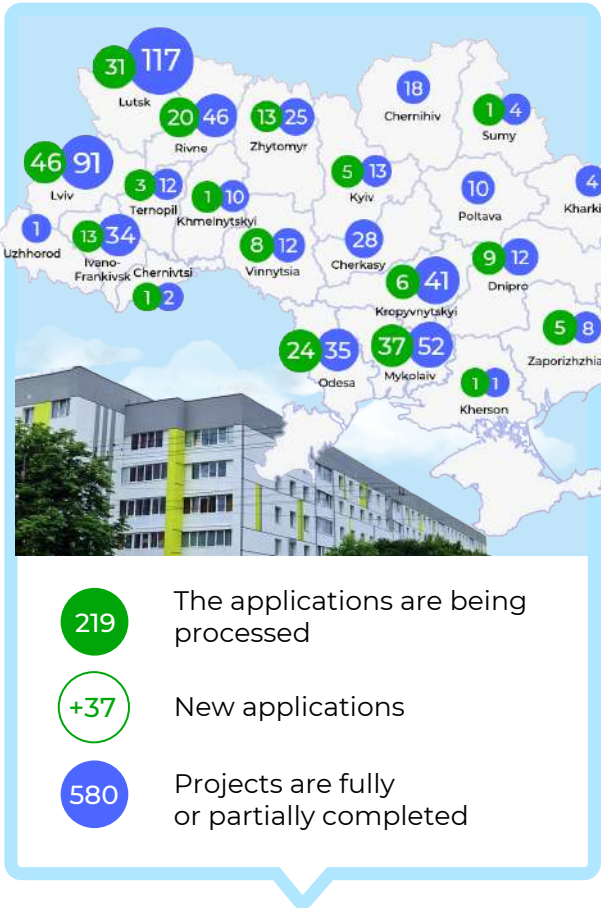


## A Success Story of Residents from a Reconstructed Multi-Apartment Building in Mykolaiv

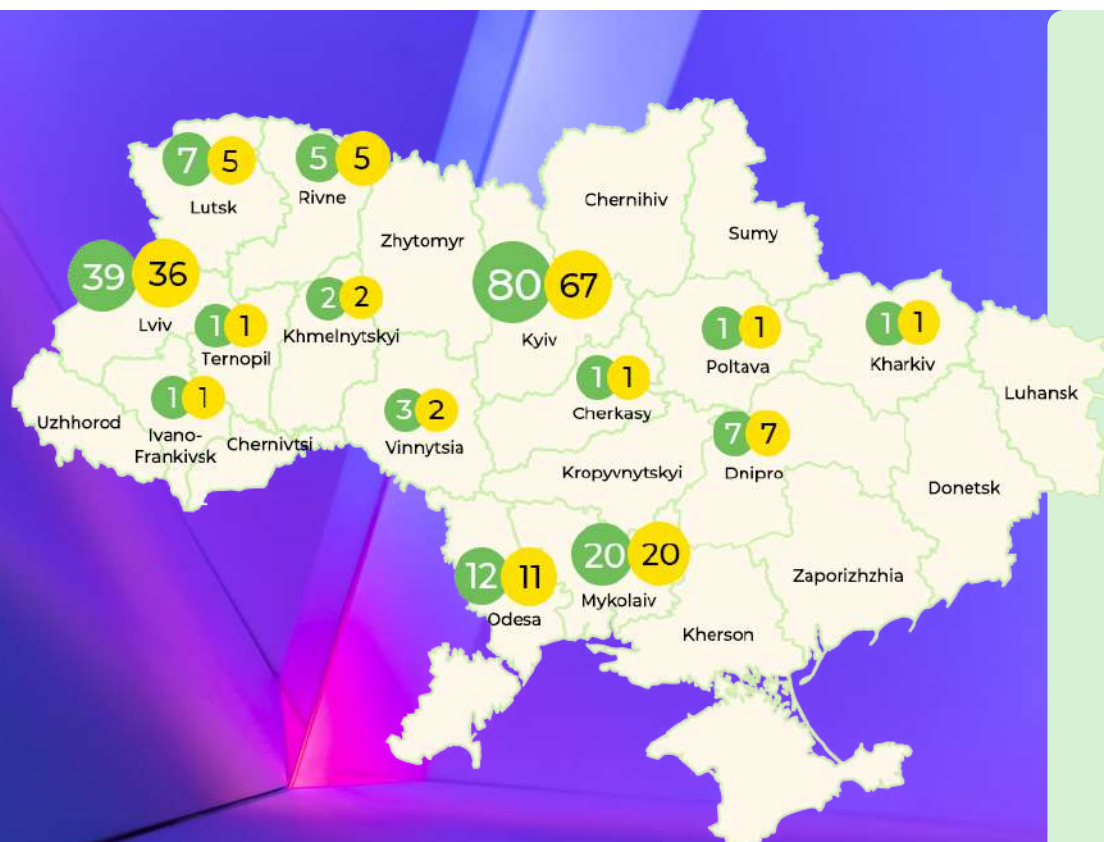
## The Success Story of the Homeowners' Association in Novoiavorivsk, Lviv region



The building of the HOA “Nash Dim – Novoiavorivsk” is already 39 years old, but thanks to participation in the “ENERGODIM” Program, it has been given a second life. Following comprehensive modernization—including facade insulation, installation of an individual heating point, and window replacement—the residents reduced energy consumption by 43.9%, saving over UAH 580 thousand annually. Now, the apartments are consistently warm and comfortable, and the building has become a model of effective change.

## Homeowners' Association "Kalyna 40": When the Sun Works for the People



In Lviv, the residents of the HOA "Kalyna 40" have become a model of energy independence. After modernization under the "ENERGODIM" Program, they installed a 30 kW solar power system. Now the building fully covers its electricity needs for elevators, pumping equipment, video surveillance, and common area lighting, saving over UAH 6 thousand per month.
